TYAD housing reaches major construction milestone

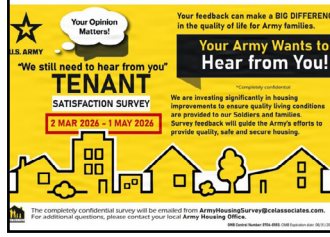

MICC contracting solution supports transformation

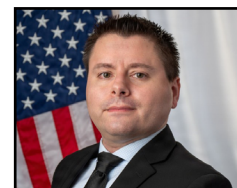
