Army redefines medical maintenance strategy

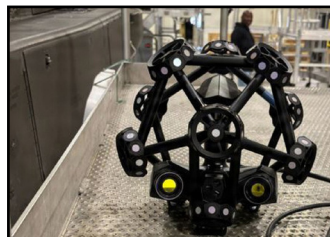
