ERDS: Streamlining and accelerating Army readiness

ROCK ISLAND ARSENAL, Ill. – The Army’s push for rapid modernization is reshaping logistics operations across installations. At Fort Bliss, Texas, that initiated a major divestiture effort to clear room for an Equipment Redistribution Divestiture Site operation, which began in May. ERDS is a capability allowing units to bring excess or outdated equipment to be quickly processed, redistributed, or turned in.
