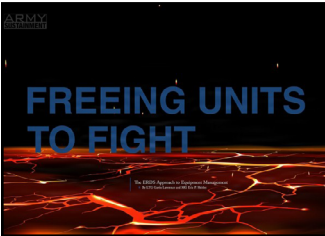

Freeing units to fight: The ERDS approach

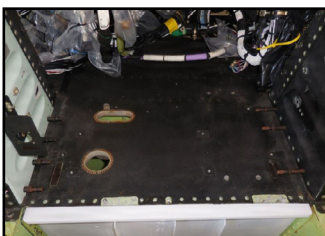
