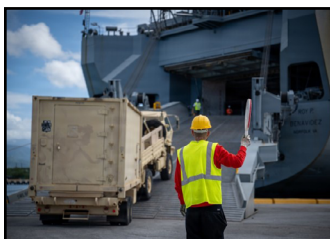

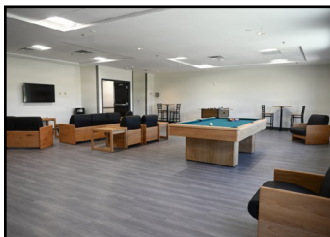

Fort Hood adds new barracks to its housing

FORT HOOD, Texas – Fort Hood held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the brand new Barracks 101 May 19, the latest addition to the improvements to housing and quality of life for Soldiers at The Great Place. The barracks are apart of a project authorized and funded by Congress in fiscal year 2022. Congress appropriated \$80 million, but the barracks were completed under budget at \$65.5 million.

FORT MCCOY, Wis. – Fort McCoy leaders and community partners gathered for a ribbon-cutting ceremony to celebrate the official opening of the installation’s new \$1.4 million main gate microgrid with battery backup project, a major investment in installation resilience, readiness and energy modernization. The system is expected to generate approximately \$20,000 in annual energy savings.
